Inventory - After inventory in February we had 3 books missing. All three were later found.

Efforts to promote reading:

- **Promotion of SORA E-books and audiobooks-** Access information was shared with students across grade levels. This is available to students 24/7. The collection is added to every year.
- **Less strict loan limits/overdue policies to promote equity of access -** We continue to allow students to sign out books even if they have overdue books.
- **Book ownership -** Students in grades PreK-4 were able to pick two new books to keep. Books were purchased with book fair profits.
- **Summer Circulation/Summer Hours -** Students in grades 2 - 11 were able to sign books out for the summer. Approximately **120** books were signed out for the summer. The library will be open two mornings a week during summer school for circulation.
- **Dolly Parton Imagination Library -** HCS continues to be an official affiliate for this program. The program sends a book every month to children ages 0-5 at no cost to families.
- **Young Adult Book Club -** Open to students in grades 9-12. We usually read 4 books a year.
